

MALTHOUSE BITTER

Malthouse Bitter is named after the great Malthouse built in 1797 in Brancaster Staithe reputedly the country's largest at that time.

It is a pale amber ale made using Maris Otter barley from Branthill Farm, Wells-Next-the-Sea and Pilot hops from Suffolk with a little extra roasted barley to give some toasty notes on the finish.

Best served cool, not chilled, carefully decanted into a clean glass, leaving the natural yeast sediment in the bottle.
